THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

BACKGROUND INFORMATION FROM DR. WALTER DELLER ON THE PSALM

Psalm 23

Today's psalm falls into a category known as trust psalms, which may have had their origins as elaborations of the motivational or trust elements in individual complaint or lament psalms. The scholar Stanley Walters referred to Psalm 23 as the "sheep's-eye" view of God. In the ancient near east, the term shepherd could refer both to people who kept sheep and to rulers or kings, and in the middle of this psalm the term for "staff" could also refer to a ruler's staff. Perhaps the most vivid moment in this psalm, which our standard translations do not reflect, is in the final verse where the root *rdp*, usually rendered as "follow" actually means something much stronger like "pursue," or "hunt down." And indeed the notion that God's goodness and mercy will hunt us down all the days of our lives is a powerful thing to hope and trust in when we find ourselves in the valley of the shadow of death.

As mentioned during Vestry, there are a number of significant capital projects that we need to undertake over the next few years in order to protect the integrity and safety of our church property. TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION MINISTRY - RED DRESS DAY

"The Lord is righteous, he loves justice." (Psalm 11:7)

May 5th is a birth date. Across Canada there are many beautiful Indigenous women and girls who have never returned home to their families. One such person was, Lisa Marie Young, a 21-year-old Tia-o-qui-aht woman (born on May 5, 1981) who disappeared under suspicious circumstances from Nanaimo, BC on Canada Day 2002. Despite hundreds of tips from the public, RCMP investigators never made an arrest in this case. The Red Dress Days began to be held across the country to honour the loss of women like Lisa Marie, and to draw attention to their disturbing fate while encouraging us to ask why Indigenous women and girls had such an increased vulnerability.

Over time the REDress Project, and subsequent REDress Days, engaged and empowered citizens to put pressure on the Canadian parliament to set up the National Inquiry into MMIWG. This inquiry began early in 2016 and included testimony from 1484 family members and survivors. A full report can be accessed through the KAIROS website. (kairoscanada.org)

As a side note: The T & R committee is looking for donations to enhance their projects: awarding an Indigenous student from the OCAD University an honorarium to create a wood sculpture for the garden in the front of the church, and hiring an Indigenous leader to help facilitate a process of defining the reflections plaques in the garden.

CONFIRMATION CLASSES
